Minutes of the Parish Council meeting held in the Village Hall on Friday

6th November 2009.

1. The Chairman welcomed the Councillors' and Parishioners' to the meeting. Apologies received from Cllr. D. Wilkinson.

2. No declaration of interest was received.

3. C09/1119, New Farm, Blackheath Road Wenhaston.

Revised drawings to incorporate the felling of the poplar plantation into the application site, and to replant creating a natural wet woodland.

The Chairman read a letter from Mr & Mrs Wollin.

The Chairman asked for the views of the Councillors' present.

It was proposed by Cllr. T. Tate and seconded by Cllr. B. Cousins that

the meeting be closed to allow Parishioners' to speak.

The general consensus of the Councillors' was that the felling of the poplar plantation and re planting a natural wet woodland would enhance the wild life, and that if designated paths within the wet woodland were established, it might encourage visitors away from Blackheath Common.

Concerns were raised from Parishioners' about the number of visitors to this new area.

Meeting closed at 6.40p.m.

I have been asked to clarify why a vote was not taken. The Parish Council has already voted on New Farm, Blackheath Road, and Suffolk Coastal only wanted our comments.

To quash the rumours that are circulating around the Village Mr Wright has stated that there is no phase 2 to this development.
